Noelle Simulation Lab....

The School of Nursing has two new patient simulators, Noelle, a birthing simulator, and Baby Hal. Both of these high fidelity simulators are wireless and are controlled by an electronic tablet. The tablet can be used to program different patient conditions for mom and baby. Some examples are normal vaginal and c-section deliveries, breech, shoulder dystoria, hemorrhage, and infant seizures. There are two monitors that display Noelle's vital signs, the fetal heart monitor tracing, and once Noelle's baby is delivered, the fetal heart rate monitor tracing changes over to Baby Hal's vital signs.

Noelle actually births a smaller version of Baby Hal. Students can insert notes in a performance log as well as perform many assessment and care activities.

These simulators are difficult to describe in a short explanation. Noelle has an extensive library of speech including Spanish. Baby Hal cries and has sounds such as respiratory distress. Both simulators are intubatable with breathing, pulses, ECGs, heart and lung sounds, color changes (cyanosis) and many more. The simulators can also be used for training purposes for hospital staff. Ventilation and chest compressions can be measured and recorded for CPR training. The school is so lucky to have such high tech simulators.

We are in the process of furnishing a simulated birthing room next to the maternity classroom. As a result of the remodeling of Graham's OB department we were able to get an older birthing bed and a crib. We have added some smaller items such as pictures on the wall, IV stand, bedside table and over the bed table. We would love to get a used infant warmer but even simulated equipment is expensive so the obtainment of additional equipment will be a work in progress for the next two years.
