- Graduation Rate Disclosure – Provides six-year graduation rate of certificate or degree-seeking, first-time, full-time undergraduate students.

Graduation Rate Disclosure

Each school must annually make available their six-year graduation rate of certificate/degree-seeking, first-time, full-time, undergraduate students to prospective and enrolled students.

The graduation rate is calculated by tracking the progress of students who began their studies as full-time, first-time, degree/certificate students to see if they complete a degree/certificate within 150% of “normal time” for completing the program in which they are enrolled. The “normal time” for completing our nursing program is 3 years or 6 semesters. 150% of the “normal time” would be 4½ years or 9 semesters.

Graham Hospital School of Nursing has a very small number of students who are full-time, first-time, degree/certificate seeking students. Most of our students have completed some course work before entering our program and are therefore not considered first-time, degree/certificate students.

In accordance with federal regulations the following information represents the graduation rates of all full-time, first-time, first-degree students at Graham Hospital School of Nursing. Due to the small number of students, and to protect student privacy, the rates are not disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, or recipient of Pell grant or loan.

Term: First-time student

Definition: A student who has no prior postsecondary experience (except as noted below) attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. This includes students enrolled in academic or occupational programs. It also includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term, and students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).

Procedures for Graduate/Employer Surveys

1. A survey of recent graduates and their employers will be conducted annually.
2. The annual Graduate/Employer Survey will be coordinated by the Director.
3. A self evaluation questionnaire will be sent to each graduate twelve months after graduation. The purpose of this survey will be to evaluate the individual graduate's opinion of his/her preparation level for employment within the year immediately following graduation.
4. The questionnaire will reflect the Program Goals of the program.
5. Each graduate will be asked to provide the name and address of the employer for whom he/she is working.
6. A similar questionnaire will then be forwarded to the employer. The purpose of this survey will be to evaluate the employer's opinion of each graduate's preparation level.
7. A graduate follow-up survey will be sent to alumni of Graham Hospital School of Nursing five years after their graduation. The purpose of this survey is to collect demographic data regarding graduates and their related professional development since graduation.
8. Data will be analyzed by the Faculty Organization as part of the overall program evaluation process.

- Retention Rate – The retention rate of certificate or degree seeking, first-time, undergraduate students.

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In accordance with federal regulations, the following information represents the retention rates of all full-time, first-time, first-degree students at Graham Hospital School of Nursing.
